Dear Parishioners,


We are pleased to announce that we will resume offering mass at 10am on Sunday, June 28th. Our regular mass attendance is within the 25% of worship space occupancy guideline. The Bishop has extended the dispensation from the obligation for attending mass during this pandemic, so if you are sick, please remain at home, and if you have any concerns about your health or the health of someone in your house, please remain at home.

In order to adhere to the protocols that have been established during this pandemic, the Mass at Immaculate Conception/St Bridget's will be different.

- When you come to church, it will be necessary that you **wear your own mask**. Please **enter church through the doors located on Frederick Douglass Circle** unless you need to utilize the ramp. There will be hand sanitizing stations located at all entrances.
- Social distancing guidelines are to be followed: Family groups may sit together as they would at home. Six-foot distancing must be maintained between non-household individuals – both during entry and exiting and during seating.
- Allowable Pews will be marked. Please follow ushers' instructions.
- **Restrooms will be closed** designated for emergency use only.
- The congregation will not be singing hymns or responses. Only the cantor will sing.
- There will be no holding of hands (except family members) during the Our Father or sign of peace.
- The ushers will take up the collection. Please drop your donation into the basket, and please avoid grabbing or touching the basket.
- Holy Communion will be distributed to one side of the congregation at a time. Your mask should be on as you process in single file, down the side aisle and up the center aisle. Maintaining six-foot distance between the person in front of you. Your palm should be up and mask on as you receive the host. Step to the side, lift your mask and consume the host. Return to your seat via the side aisle. There will be no coffee hour after mass.
- Please exit the church via the Frederick Douglass and Edinburgh doors.
- There should be NO social gatherings or groupings prior to or after Mass. Please disperse promptly.

As noted in <u>Bishop Matano's letter to the faithful</u>, reopening will be a gradual process. Please be patient and bear with us, as we work out safety and logistical precautions to keep both parishioners and priests safe from the Coronavirus that is still present in the general population.

Juneteenth (a <u>portmanteau</u> of *June* and *nineteenth* (also known as Freedom Day, Jubilee Day, and Liberation Day, is an <u>unofficial</u> American holiday celebrated annually on the 19th of <u>June</u> in the <u>United States</u> to commemorate <u>Union army</u> general <u>Gordon Granger</u>'s reading of federal orders in the city of <u>Galveston</u>, <u>Texas</u>, on 19 June 1865, proclaiming that all <u>enslaved</u> persons in the <u>U.S. state</u> of Texas were now free. Although the <u>Emancipation Proclamation</u> had formally freed them almost two and a half years earlier, and the <u>American Civil War</u> had largely ended with the defeat of the <u>Confederate States</u> in April, Texas was the most remote of the <u>slave states</u>, with a low presence of Union troops, so enforcement of the proclamation had been slow and inconsistent.

Celebrations date to 1866, at first involving church-centered community gatherings in Texas. It spread across <u>the South</u> and became more commercialized in the 1920s and 1930s, often centering on a <u>food festival</u>. During the <u>Civil Rights movement</u> of the 1960s, it was eclipsed by the struggle for postwar civil rights, but grew in popularity again in the 1970s with a focus on <u>African American</u> freedom and arts. By the 21st century, Juneteenth was celebrated in most major cities across the United States. Activists are campaigning for the <u>United States Congress</u> to recognize Juneteenth as a <u>national holiday</u>. Juneteenth is recognized as a state holiday or special day of observance in 48 of the 50 <u>U.S. states</u>.

Modern observance is primarily in local celebrations. Traditions include public readings of the Emancipation Proclamation, singing traditional songs such as "<u>Swing Low, Sweet Chariot</u>" and "<u>Lift Every Voice and Sing</u>", and reading of works by noted <u>African-American</u> writers such as <u>Ralph Ellison</u> and <u>Maya Angelou</u>. Celebrations include rodeos, <u>street fairs, cookouts, family reunions</u>, park parties, <u>historical reenactments</u>, and Miss Juneteenth contests. The <u>Mascogos</u>, descendants of <u>Black Seminoles</u>, of <u>Coahuila</u>, <u>Mexico</u>, also celebrate Juneteenth.
