The Christmas Manger

The manger or stable itself carries with it two significant images. One is the carpenter's

skill which is reflected in the early life of Jesus, a trade in which many people identified Him. The other image is the brown wood of the manger which points to the cross; that which once held the infant Savior of the world was also used to hold Him up before the world for all to see. God the Master carpenter has fashioned for us a masterpiece of salvation. Do we see the crosses on our life as a sign of hope and an opportunity to trust in God? The straw and the animals— beasts of burden serve to remind us of the role of Jesus' mission: The task to support and carrying the burdens of our sins from the cross. The shepherds and sheep speak to us of the simple and poor to whom Jesus came to give the good news. Their position like ours is one of humble adoration and acceptance to the activity of God in their lives. Then there is the star which glows over the manger. A beacon of light to direct us straight to Jesus so we, too, can worship Him. In the Christian tradition, the symbolism of the star is seen in scripture and the Church. The question for us is, "Do we take the time to read and listen?" Finally, there's Mary and Joseph, our parents in faith, who allow themselves to be the instruments of God's incarnation. They speak so eloquently of us who are called to be, as St. Francis proclaims in the very first Christmas manger, the instruments of God's peace.

Living Faith Are We Amazed?

All who heard it were amazed by what ad been told them by the shepherds. Luke 2:18

From the birth of Jesus onward, a response of astonishment, wonder and sometimes bewilderment accompanied those associated with his presence. All through the Gospels, we continually read about this response. People are "amazed" when the shepherds tell them about the angels' message and having seen the newborn Child. Mary and Joseph are "amazed at what was said about him" (Luke 2:33) when Simeon foretells the future of Jesus. When this twelve-year old sits among the knowledgeable rabbis in the Temple, they are "astounded at his understanding and his answers" (Luke 2:47). And so it continues throughout his life. Wherever Jesus goes, whatever he does, it results in people's awe and surprise.

What about us on this feast day commemorating his birth? What is our response to this person of great love who came and dwelt among us? Are we amazed?
