## **Prayer Vigil for Reparations**

Sixty members of the Greater Rochester Community attended the Repair and Redress Praver Vigil Thursday evening. August 18 at Immaculate Conception Church. NETWORK Lobby for Catholic Social Justice welcomed the Rochester community to pray, to listen to truth-tellers share about their own experiences of racism and discrimination, and to learn about an effort to lobby President Biden to establish an H.R. 40-style Commission to Study and Develop Reparation Proposals for African Americans. Fr. Ray opened with prayer. Speakers included George Fontenette, a life member of Immaculate whose family owned many businesses in the Clarissa Street area prior to the construction of the inner loop in Rochester which decimated thriving neighborhoods and Black-owned businesses. Rev. William Wilkinson spoke about the effects of institutional racism on persons of color and indigenous persons who were deprived of economic opportunity, inability to own and reside in homes in many neighborhoods due to the practice of redlining, and much more. Blood sisters Isabella Walters and Roxana Weber shared the story of their brother, Fr. Charles Hall who desired to enter the seminary and was turned away in Rochester because no Black candidates could be accepted. He became a Josephite priest but suffered from colon cancer and died at a young age. His story is the story of Black Catholic men and women who were turned away from a Catholic Church who would not accept black candidates into white religious communities or seminaries.

The notion of Reparation includes all these examples and more! It would be the Commission's responsibility to recommend options which might be considered to make amends to the African-American community. This could include looking at legal practices, civil rights, opportunities for higher education, etc. Please take a moment to send an e-mail to President Biden through NETWORK or call on the White House Comment Line to ask President Biden to establish a Commission to study and make recommendations to Congress. When HR 40 was introduced in Congress again this year by Rep. Shirley Jackson... it passed out of committee and is waiting to be voted on the House Floor. This bill has bi-partisan support.
