Repair & Redress Prayer Vigil

NETWORK Lobby for Catholic Social Justice invites you to join members of the Rochester community at Immaculate Conception/St. Bridget's Catholic Church, 445 *Frederick Douglass St.*, on Thursday, August 18 at 6:30 p.m. to pray, listen to Truth Tellers share about their own experiences of racism and discrimination, and learn about the effort to lobby President Biden to establish an H.R. 40-style Commission to Study and Develop Reparation Proposals for African Americans.

The purpose of the Commission is to examine slavery and discrimination in the colonies and the United States from 1619 until the present and recommend appropriate remedies. H.R. 40 has been introduced in Congress every year since 1989 by Representative John Conyers until his retirement. It was introduced this year by Representative Shirley Jackson Lee and was passed out of committee. H.R. 40 refers to the 40 acres of land and a mule that was supposed to be given to emancipated slaves at the end of the Civil War. This promise was never fulfilled. The failure to do so has led to economic and social repression which has endured for generations.
